Class 1

Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2022 – ENTRY FEE £20

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over of any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2022. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on 27th August 2022.

All entries **MUST** have a current RoR competition registration and have **raced in GB**. The class will be run under the rules of RoR. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series.

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won: a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc. SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB), BSPS, BSPA, TATTERSALLS RoR Open Show Series Qualifier, TARRA RIDDEN, RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier or any other open class **except** Tattersalls (TBA) RoR Challenge Show Series or other Working Hunter type classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not taken into account.

Horses **WILL** be ridden by the judge. Horses will be stripped for conformation.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won (win) three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships

Prizes – Rosette 1st - 4th and Vouchers 1st-3rd
1st £40 plus RoR prize, 2nd £30 3rd £20

Class 2

Tattersalls RoR Scottish Open Show Series Qualifier 2022 - ENTRY FEE £20

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2022. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first three go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show 2023. In the event that the first three are already qualified, the qualification will go down the line to fourth.

All entries **MUST** have **current competition registration with the RoR** and have **Raced in GB**. There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran (15 years and over). The class will be run under the rules of the RoR. Horses to be ridden by the judge. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. **Racing injuries and Blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series.**

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with chinstrap.

Prizes - Rosettes 1st to 4th place - Vouchers 1st to 3rd place - 1st £40 plus voucher for jacket 2nd £30, 3rd £20. Veteran prize £20 voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree in August 2022

Class 3.

Tattersall RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2022 - ENTRY FEE £20

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered horses**, 3 years and over, fillies, mares and geldings. **Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.** Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a Bitless/Inhand Bridle. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorse Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

This class is a qualifier for the RoR OPEN In Hand Showing Series FINAL.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on August 27th 2022. RoR prizes will not be awarded to the RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand

Rosettes : 1st to 4th

Prizes - 1st £30 plus RoR prize 2nd £20, 3rd £10

CLASS 4

HCR Ridden Ex Racehorse – ENTRY FEE £15.00

For Horses 4 years and over (male or female). Riders must be 14 years & over

The Horse & Country Racehorse (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Ridden horses must be 4 years and over and veteran horses must be 12 years and over. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but may be asked to gallop in your individual show.

To compete at the HCR Championships the handler/rider **and** horse must be registered with the HCR. Members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st - 4th (qualification *may* be passed down to 6th place). Non-members must send their qualification card (presented by the judge) fees and register with the HCR before the closing date for entries for the HCR Championships Show at Netherton Equestrian on Sunday 11 September 2022.

CLASS 5

HCR In Hand Ex Racehorse - ENTRY FEE £15.00

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series: To qualify for the Championship Show at Netherton Equestrian Centre Sunday 11th September 2022, the rider **and** horse must be registered with HCR, you must carry your cards in the ring for signing and be placed 1st - 4th (qualifications *may* be passed down to 6th place). Non-members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR before the closing date for entries for the HCR Championship Show

1st & 2nd PLACED HORSES FROM CLASSES 1 – 5 WILL BE INVITED TO COME FORWARD FOR THE EX RACEHORSE CHAMPIONSHIP WITH CASH PRIZES TO CHAMPION & RESERVE KINDLY SPONSORED BY BRIAN & JACKIE STOREY

CLASS 6.

TATTERSALLS RoR FORMER RACEHORSE CHALLENGE SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2022 – ENTRY FEE £20.00 – please note that this class will only take place if there are 6 or more entries.

Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2022. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. **All entries must be registered with RoR and HAVE raced in GB. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.** The judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.** All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on 27th August 2022

The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30%** awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 jumps 3 foot (90cm) to 3 foot 3 inches (1 metre) with a maximum spread of 95 centimeters)

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down.

15 points to be deducted for a refusal.

20 points for second refusal.

Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. *(In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)*

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements:

Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of **30%** for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Please Note that Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 3'6" (1.05 metre)

Prizes : Rosettes and Vouchers 1st to 3rd place.

1st £30 plus RoR prize, 2nd £20 3rd £10

RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand.

Veteran prize (15+): £20 voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran Final at The Jockey Club National Championships at Aintree on 27th August 2022

THOROUGHBRED DRESSAGE

The dressage classes listed below are open to any Thoroughbred (raced or unraced) which holds a Weatherby's Passport

Dress code as per BD rules. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle bridle. Hard hat with chinstrap complying to current safety standards must be worn. Horses should be plaited

CLASS 7 – BD INTRO B – ENTRY FEE £14.00

CLASS 8 – BD PRELIM 13 – ENTRY FEE £14.00

CLASS 9 – BD NOVICE 28 – ENTRY FEE £14.00 (FOR COMBINATION NEVER PLACED IN NOVICE TEST)

CLASS 10 – BD NOVICE 34 – ENTRY FEE £14 (OPEN TO ALL THOROUGHBREDS)

Rosettes & Prizes from 1st to 6th place in classes 7 - 10

SHOW JUMPING

Class 11 – Unaffiliated Showjumping 75cm – ENTRY FEE £15.00

For Thoroughbred mares and geldings 4 years and over. Riders must be 15 years or over on 1 January 2022 to be run under BS Rules. Rosettes & Prizes from 1st to 6th.

Class 12 – Unaffiliated Showjumping 85cm - ENTRY FEE £15.00

For Thoroughbred mares and geldings 4 yrs and over. Riders must be 15 years or over on 1 January 2022. To be run under BS Rules. Rosettes & Prizes from 1st to 6th.

Class 13 – Unaffiliated Showjumping 95cm – ENTRY FEE £15.00

For Thoroughbred mares and geldings 4 yrs and over. Riders must be 15 years or over on 1 January 2022. To be run under BS Rules. Rosettes & Prizes from 1st to 6th.
