Class 1 - Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2024
ENTRY FEE £20.00 – Kindly Sponsored by FALCONS EVENTS

Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2024

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height, must have raced in GB and have current RoR Competition Membership.

Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes.

Horses will be ridden by the Judge and will be stripped for conformation assessment. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series.

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships Aintree, August 24th 2024. RoR rosettes 1st -4th and a RoR branded prize to be redeemed from the RoR Office.

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won: a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open /Amateur Ridden Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, or any other open class except Tattersalls RoR Challenge Show Series, other Working Hunter type classes or In Hand classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not considered.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won (win) three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.

Class 2 - Tattersalls RoR Scottish Open Show Series Qualifier 2025 - ENTRY FEE £20.00 – Kindly Sponsored by SPILLERS

Tattersalls RoR Scottish Open Show Series Qualifier 2024

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height.

Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes.

Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

All entries MUST have current RoR competition registration and have RACED in GB. **There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over.** The class will be run under the rules of RoR. Horses to be ridden by the judge. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

The first three go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show June 2025. If the first three are already qualified, the qualification will go down the line to fourth.

Prizes : Rosettes 1st to 4th place, Vouchers 1st to 3rd place and a branded prize to the winner – prize to be redeemed from the RoR office.

Veteran prize – a voucher for a branded prize to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Ridden Veteran final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree 2024.

Class 3 - Tattersalls RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2024 – Entry Fee £20.00 – Kindly Sponsored by HEXHAM RACECOURSE

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 24th 2024

RoR rosettes 1st – 4th and a branded prize to the winner. Prize to be redeemed from the RoR Office.

CLASS 4 - Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2025

Entry Fee £20.00 – Kindly Sponsored by HAYDON POINT TO POINT

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under ‘riding horse’ format without ‘type’ being taken into consideration. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2025. RoR rosettes 1st – 4th and a RoR branded prize to the winner to be redeemed from the RoR Office. The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree in August 2024. A branded prize will be presented to the highest placed Veteran horse (15+) and qualification to the RoR Ridden Veteran Final also at Aintree in August 2024. Prize to be redeemed from the RoR Office.

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st 2023. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

RoR COMPETITORS PLEASE NOTE:- FOR THOSE QUALIFYING FOR THE 2024 JOCKEY CLUB RoR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, NAMELY 1ST-3RD FROM CLASSES 1 AND 3 AND THE WINNERS FROM CLASSES 2 AND 4, ENTRIES CLOSE FOR AINTREE ON 1ST AUGUST 2024.

CLASS 5 - HCR RIDDEN Ex Racehorse - ENTRY FEE £15.00

HCR Ridden Ex Racehorse; horses 4 years old and over, any sex, riders 14 years and over.

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and non members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR after the qualifying show. To qualify you should be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place).

All handlers/riders and horses must become registered with HCR ahead of the championships and must have qualified in order to compete at the HCR championships at Netherton Equestrian on 7th / 8th September 2024.

CLASS 6

HCR IN HAND EX RACEHORSE – ENTRY FEE £15.00

HCR Inhand Ex Racehorse; horses any age and sex, handlers to be 14 years and over.

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound.

HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and non members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR after the qualifying show. To qualify you should be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place).

All handlers/riders and horses must become registered with HCR ahead of the championships and must have qualified in order to compete at the HCR championships at Netherton Equestrian on 7th / 8th September 2024.

Dress code as per BD rules. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle bridle. Hard hat with chinstrap complying to current safety standards must be worn. Horses should be plaited. **An RoR rosette will be awarded to the highest placed registered RoR horse in each of the dressage classes.**

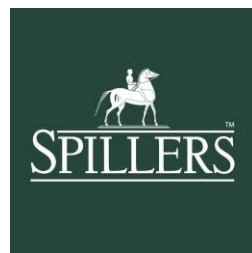
